<b>Panels Submissions:</b>	
I would like to hold a panel session at the conference. How do I submit my request?	All panel requests must be submitted to the 2021 submission website. To be considered a panel, you are required to have 3-5 panelists. Visit <a href="http://www.alsb.org/annual-conference">http://www.alsb.org/annual-conference</a> Click on <b>Conference Call for Participation</b> The first question on the submission form is to select your presentation type. Please remember to select <b>Panel</b> .
What is the deadline to submit my panel request?	11:59 PM on <b>May 16</b> <b>NOTE:</b> Only the Chair of the panel should complete the submission. Please do not make multiple submissions for the same panel. <b>Please include the available dates of your panelists in the submission process.</b>
When will I find out if my panel has been accepted?	Panelists will be notified of acceptance within one week of the panel submission deadline.
What makes for a good panel proposal?	The best panels bring together diverse voices from among the Academy membership to address an issue of importance to the discipline, to support the professional development of our members, and/or to explore an emerging scholarly issue related to research or teaching. Please consider whether your panelists reflect the diversity of the Academy's membership. Conference organizers will review favorably proposals for panels that are broadly inclusive in terms of gender, race, ethnicity, type of institution, and seniority of panelists. We reserve the right to suggest additional panelists when proposals would be improved by a more diverse mix of voices.
If my panel is accepted, when will it be scheduled?	We will schedule one panel per breakout session. Please be sure to include the dates all panelists are attending the conference with your submission. <b>Shelly would like to have all panels scheduled by May 31.</b>
If I did not submit my panel request by the May 16 deadline, can I still submit a request?	Only if we have panel slots still available.

One submission only please.</b></p>
<p><b>What is the submission deadline if I want my paper to be considered for an <u>award</u>?</b></p>	<p><b>See award deadlines on next page.</b></p>
<p>What is the difference between an Academic Session and a Development Track?</p>	<p>Fully completed papers ready to be uploaded by or before June 20 will be scheduled under the <b>Academic Sessions</b>.</p> <p>The <b>Development Track</b> is for works in progress, for which a completed paper will not be ready to be uploaded by or before June 20. Development Track presentations should nonetheless be based on well-developed and researched works in progress. If you have a very early-stage research idea that you are interested in discussing with colleagues in a supportive, nonjudgmental environment, please be on the lookout for additional information about a new opportunity for feedback called "H.E.L.P. Sessions" (<b>H</b>ashing out <b>E</b>arly and <b>L</b>atent <b>P</b>rojects), which have been added to the conference lineup.</p>
<p>What is the <b>deadline for <u>submitting</u></b> my presentation title, abstract and paper for the <b>Academic Sessions</b> as a <b><u>non-award</u></b> submission?</p>	<p>11:59 PM on <b>June 20</b></p>
<p>Do I need to upload my completed paper if I am presenting in an Academic Session as a non-award submission?</p>	<p><b>Yes!</b> If you want to present in an Academic Session, you must upload your paper in <b><u>WORD</u></b> format to the Call for Participation system.</p>
<p>What is the <b>deadline for <u>uploading</u></b> my paper to the submission site to make sure I am in an <b>Academic Session</b> as a <b><u>non-award</u></b> submission?</p>	<p>11:59 PM on <b>June 20</b>  <b>NOTE:</b> This is the deadline for submitting papers <b>NOT</b> being considered for an award.</p>
<p>What happens if I do not upload my paper by the deadline for an Academic Session as a non-award submission?</p>	<p>You will automatically be placed in the Development Track.</p>
<p>Can I get an extension for uploading my paper for an Academic Session as a non-award submission?</p>	<p>No extensions will be given.</p>
<p>What is the <b>deadline for <u>submitting</u></b> my presentation title and abstract for the <b>Development Track</b>?</p>	<p>11:59 PM on <b>June 20</b></p>
<p>Do I need to upload a paper if I'm presenting in the Development Track?</p>	<p><b>No</b>, you do not need to upload a paper if you are presenting in the Development Track.</p> <p>If you have a handout to share with attendees, please send to Shelly Whitmer (<a href="mailto:sjmoore@umich.edu">sjmoore@umich.edu</a>) and she will post to the ALSB website.</p>

Can a <b>student</b> submit a paper and not attend the conference?	No, when a student submits a paper for the competition, they agree to attend and present if they are selected.

<b>NEW:</b> Can I submit a paper for one of the Section Awards if I am not a member of that Section?	No, you must be a member of the Section that sponsors the award for which you are submitting a paper.
<b>NEW:</b> Can I submit my paper for more than one award?	A paper may be submitted for only one award; except a paper may be submitted for any one award and for the Holmes-Cardozo. However, no more than one paper per author may be submitted for the Holmes-Cardozo.
How do I nominate someone for the <b>Bonsignore Award</b> ?	Submit nominations directly to Carolyn Plump, Editor-in-Chief of the <i>Journal of Legal Studies in Education</i> , at <a href="mailto:plump@lasalle.edu">plump@lasalle.edu</a> by 11:59 PM on <b>June 1</b> .
Is it possible to submit a paper for an award even if I am not presenting the paper at the conference?	No, you must present the paper at the conference.
Does a publication in ABLJ preclude publishing a version of the paper in the Proceedings?	Yes

## Coordinated Academic Sessions

This year we are offering you the opportunity to self-organize “Coordinated Academic Sessions” for paper presentations. If you have identified two others (for a total of three presentations) who will be presenting papers on related topics or in related areas of inquiry, **you will complete the submission for your own paper and list the other two papers in the "Comments or Questions Box" at the end of the form**, and we will ensure that the three of you are assigned to the same paper presentation session. Each paper listed in the "comments and questions box" will need to include (a) presenters' names, (b) paper titles, and (c) a description of the shared topic or area for the session (e.g., Insider Trading, Business and Human Rights, Patents, International Financial Regulation, Whistleblowing). If you are looking to form a Coordinated Academic Session, we encourage you to check with the officers of the relevant ALSB Section who may be able to help you identify other members of that Section who are presenting papers on a related topic.

**Each paper must complete their own separate submission form and list the other two papers in the Comments or Questions box.**

Of course, you need not coordinate your own session. If you prefer to be assigned by the conference organizers to an Academic Session with papers in the same broad topic area as your paper, simply complete the form with details for your paper.

## Coordinated Development Track Sessions

This year we are offering you the opportunity to self-organize “Coordinated Development Track Sessions” for paper presentations. If you have identified two others (for a total of three presentations) who will be presenting papers on related topics or in related areas of inquiry, **you will complete the submission for your own paper and list the other two papers in the "Comments or Questions Box" at the end of the form**, and we will ensure that the three of you are assigned to the same paper presentation session. Each paper listed in the "comments and questions box" will need to include (a) presenters' names, (b) paper titles, and (c) a description of the shared topic or area for the session (e.g., Insider Trading, Business and Human Rights, Patents, International Financial Regulation, Whistleblowing). If you are looking to form a Coordinated Development Track Session, we encourage you to check with the officers of the relevant ALSB Section who may be able to help you identify other members of that Section who are presenting papers on a related topic.

**Each paper must complete their own separate submission form and list the other two papers in the Comments or Questions box.**

Of course, you need not coordinate your own session. If you prefer to be assigned by the conference organizers to a Development Track Session with papers in the same broad topic area as your paper, simply complete the form with details for your paper.

## Scheduling of Papers

A common question each year is how we go about grouping papers for presentation at the conference. Setting aside the Coordinated sessions described above, papers are grouped by author-provided topic categories. Please note that authors are asked to provide the topic category that best fits their paper during the submission process. The papers are scheduled to group as much as possible those with the same categories provided by the author(s), subject to dates the presenting author(s) is/are available to attend and other conflicts as indicated.

For example, while four papers addressing the same general theme may be submitted to the conference, if the four authors indicate different topic categories for their papers, they likely will not be scheduled in the same session. Each paper will instead be scheduled in a session with other papers whose authors selected the same topic category.
