Guest Speaker: Laura Holoubek

The Global Nature of the Horse Industry

Ralph Bunche Best International Paper Award

Purpose and Frequency:

The Ralph Bunche Award for Outstanding International Paper recognizes outstanding current and unpublished scholarship on international business law issues. This award may be given annually. The presentation of the award shall be made during the International Section's meeting at the annual conference of the ALSB or at another time and location as best determined by the ALSB President Elect/Conference Chair and the leadership of the International Section.

Eligibility:

To be eligible for this award, at least one author must be an ALSB member in good standing and present the paper at the annual conference. At least one author must also be a member of the International Section and attend the International Section's meeting at the annual conference. Papers may not have been published or accepted for publication by the time of submission for this award or presented at a prior annual conference (unless previously presented as a Development Track paper). Current officers of the International Section are ineligible for this award.

Criteria:

Eligible papers will be judged on their scholarly contribution, research quality, topic interest, writing quality, and readiness for distribution/publication. Papers must take an international or comparative approach to address a business law issue, including, but not limited to, an assessment of foreign law or regulations, examination of international law or legal theory, and analysis of international judicial or tribunal decisions or U.S. judicial decisions addressing international law. Submissions focused exclusively or primarily on U.S. domestic legal matters are not eligible for this award.

Selection Process:

Authors must follow the following submission guidelines for their papers to be considered for the Award. Papers must be submitted electronically in conformity with instructions and deadline set forth in the ALSB Winter and Spring Newsletters. Submissions must contain a separately attached cover page indicating the author's name, position, school affiliation, address, telephone number, and e-mail address as well as clearly state the award for which the paper is being submitted. This page will be removed for purposes of ensuring blind review.

The selection committee will conduct a blind peer review of all eligible papers. The selection committee will select up to three papers as finalists. The finalists will be invited to present their papers in a designated paper session at the annual conference, and it is expected that finalists will present their papers in this session. In the event that a finalist is unable to present the paper at the annual conference, the International Section officers reserve the right to reject the submission and, if appropriate, select a replacement finalist.

Committee:

The selection committee will be comprised of the International Section officers or their designees.

ALSB International Business Law Colloquium

CALL FOR PAPERS

The ALSB International Section is pleased to announce the inaugural **International Business Law Colloquium**, which will take place at the 2022 ALSB Annual Conference. The overarching objective of the International Colloquium is to encourage, support, and showcase scholarly research by ALSB members on international issues related to the legal environment of business. Selected papers will receive detailed feedback from discussants and other participants.

Format:

- The International Colloquium will be held on **Thursday, July 28, 2022 from 2:00 PM to 5:00 PM.**
- It is anticipated that three papers will be selected for the International Colloquium. Approximately 40 minutes will be allocated for each paper, which will include a 5 minute introduction by the author(s), 5-10 minutes for discussant comments, and the remaining 25-30 minutes devoted to group discussion.
- Participants will include the selected authors and invited discussants, current International Section officers and their invitees. Papers will be circulated among the participants prior to the conference, and participants will be required to read the papers and come prepared to contribute to the group discussion.

Selection:

- Submissions will be evaluated on the basis of the following criteria: (1) contribution to the relevant literature; (2) topicality and relation to the field of international business law (or a related sub-field); (3) potential benefit of the International Colloquium to the paper and the author; and (4) suitability for potential publication in the American Business Law Journal, an international law journal, or another law journal.
- Submissions should substantively engage with international business law or related topics or the international or comparative dimensions of a domestic area of law or otherwise address the transnational or global dimensions of business. Submissions focused exclusively or primarily on domestic (U.S. or otherwise) legal matters will not be considered.
- Co-authored papers are welcome, and one or more co-authors may participate in the International Colloquium.
- Submissions should not have been published or accepted for publication.
- Authors may not submit the same paper for both the International Colloquium and the Ralph Bunche Award for Outstanding International Paper at the 2022 ALSB Annual Conference. Authors may submit the paper for the Holmes-Cardozo Award and present papers in a regular paper session at the 2022 ALSB Annual Conference in addition to participating in the International Colloquium.
- Submissions will be reviewed and selected for the International Colloquium by the International Section officers.

ALSB International Business Law Colloquium CALL FOR PAPERS (continued)

Selection:

- The deadline for submissions (see “To Participate” below) is May 1, 2022. Authors will be notified of their selection by the end of May 2022 and will be required to provide a complete draft by July 6, 2022. Papers will be circulated to all participants shortly thereafter.
- Authors agree to acknowledge the ALSB International Business Law Colloquium in a footnote when the article is published.

To Participate:

- If you wish to participate in the International Colloquium as an author, please send an email with an abstract of your paper and a brief explanation of how the paper would benefit from the International Colloquium.
